## *Gaia* by Luke Jerram UK

Measuring seven metres in diameter, *Gaia* is a precisely proportioned miniature of our earth, floating in three dimensions, and illuminated from within. The artwork by UK artist Luke Jerram aims to recreate the Overview Effect, a cognitive shift reported by astronauts viewing the earth from space. Common features of the experience are a feeling of awe for the planet, a profound understanding of the interconnection of all life, and a renewed sense of responsibility for taking care of the environment.

*Gaia* was created in partnership with the Natural Environment Research Council (NERC), Bluedot and the UK Association for Science and Discovery Centres. With supporting partners Culture Liverpool and Liverpool Cathedral.


# Asthma Management at WOMADelaide

# Taste the World Recipe

ONDATRÓPICA



## Ingredients

- 500g salmon
- 2 lemons
- 1 purple onion, preferably
- 2 tomatoes
- Seasoning herbs
- 60g turmeric
- 30g cumin
- 1 paprika
- 500g fresh coconut
- Salt
- 200g spring onions



## SALMON VICHERO

### Instructions/Method

Start by washing the salmon with lemon, rinse it and marinate it with viche, salt and pepper. In a separate container, prepare the sauce or cream with the tomato, onion, paprika, spices, herbs and coconut.

After preparing the sauce, start searing the salmon in a pan with the oil, when it is golden brown add a little more viche and introduce it in the sauce, let it cook for 5 minutes over low heat allowing the salmon to unify with the sauce – and that's it.

## Greening Australia

### The forests WOMADelaide built

Since 2007, \$2 from every WOMADelaide ticket sold has been invested into planting native trees and shrubs in regional South Australia.

In this long-running partnership between Greening Australia and the WOMADelaide Foundation, the festival's carbon emissions footprint is measured each year and offset through revegetation plantings, helping to tackle climate change – and restoring local landscapes for people and nature.

The WOMADelaide Forests now cover 107 hectares on Kaurna, Ngarrindjeri and Peramangk Country. As they grow, storing carbon in their trunks, branches and roots, they are also providing food and shelter for our iconic wildlife.

In 2022, Greening Australia collaborated with the Hills and Fleurieu Landscape Board to bring the WOMADelaide forests to the southern Fleurieu Peninsula, supporting the Back from the Brink Project.

We invited community volunteers to help plant 17 hectares of shrubland and woodland heath, to help the endangered Mount Lofty Ranges Chestnut-rumped Heathwren and the critically endangered Beautiful Firetail Finch (as well as many other local flora and fauna species).

Reducing our impact and restoring nature is globally important for tackling climate change and biodiversity loss – the WOMADelaide forests bring these actions home by reducing the festival's footprint and helping our unique local species too.




